How do we know if it's a fact, a theory based on data, an opinion or speculation?

"Don't believe everything you read on the Internet!"

	Definition	Evidence	Example
Fact	something that can't be argued, it happened, it exists	You can easily prove it. You know it to be true or have experience. You cross check it easily.	Space travel is a fact Dodos are extinct
